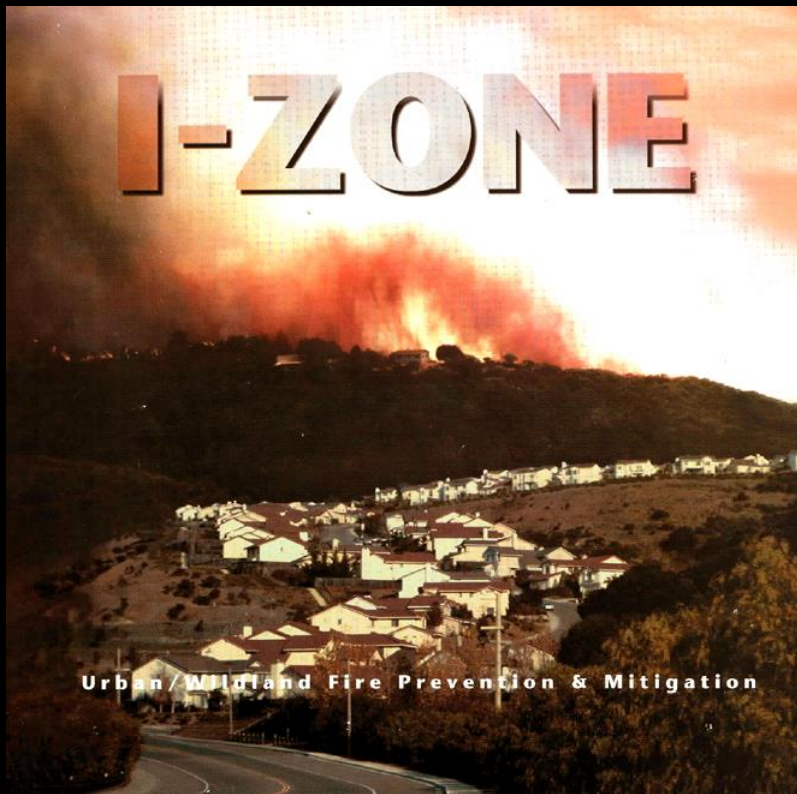

The I-ZONE

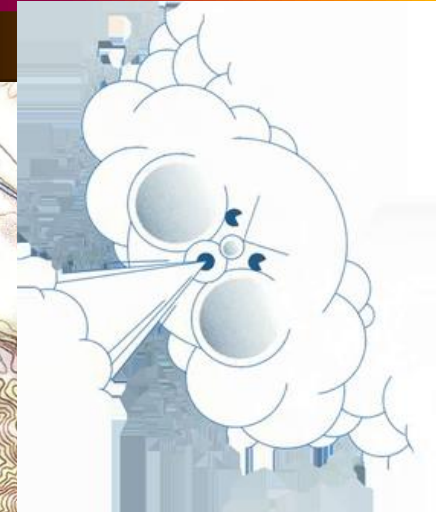
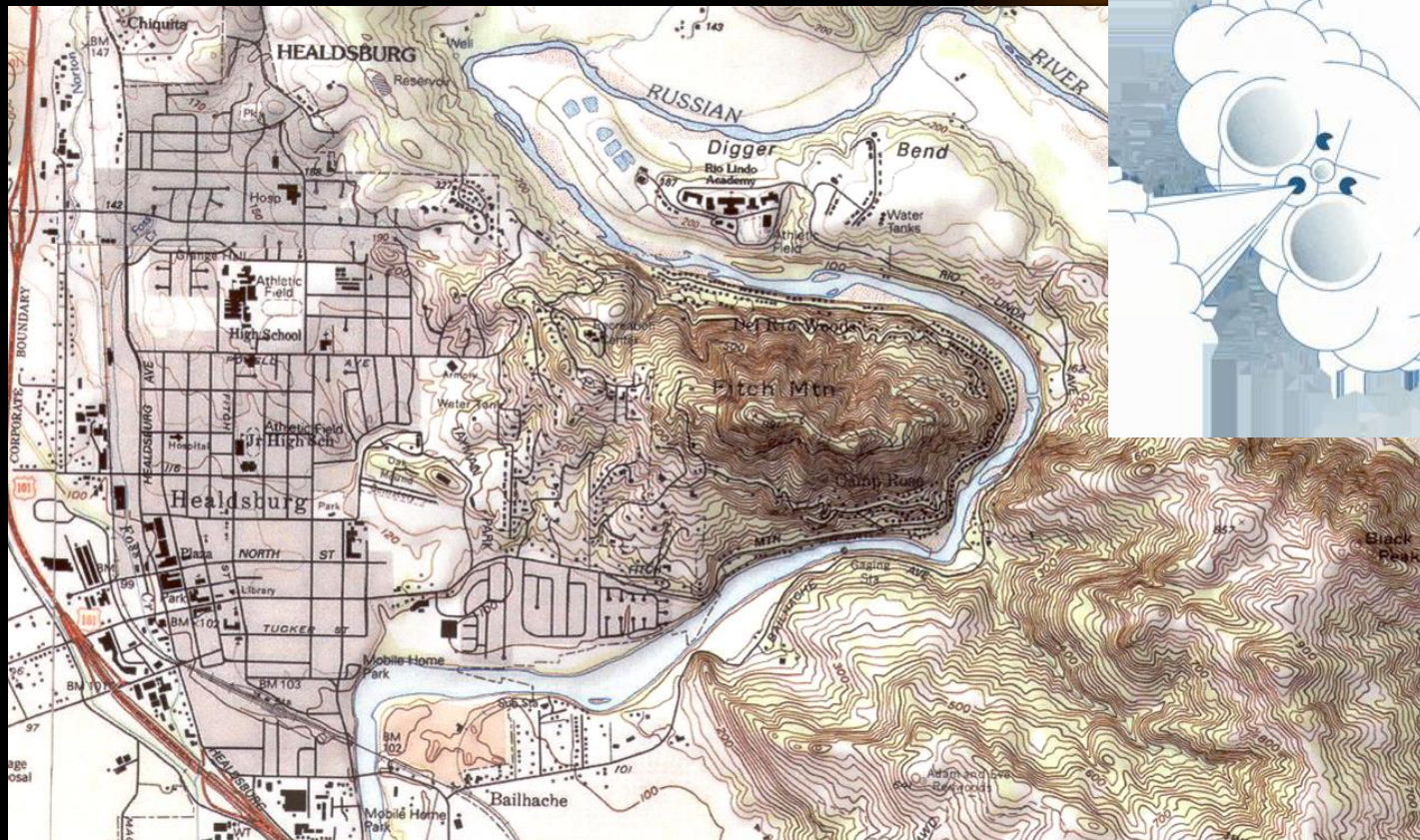
is the Interface Between the Wildland and the Home.

Been Blowing Hard All Morning!*



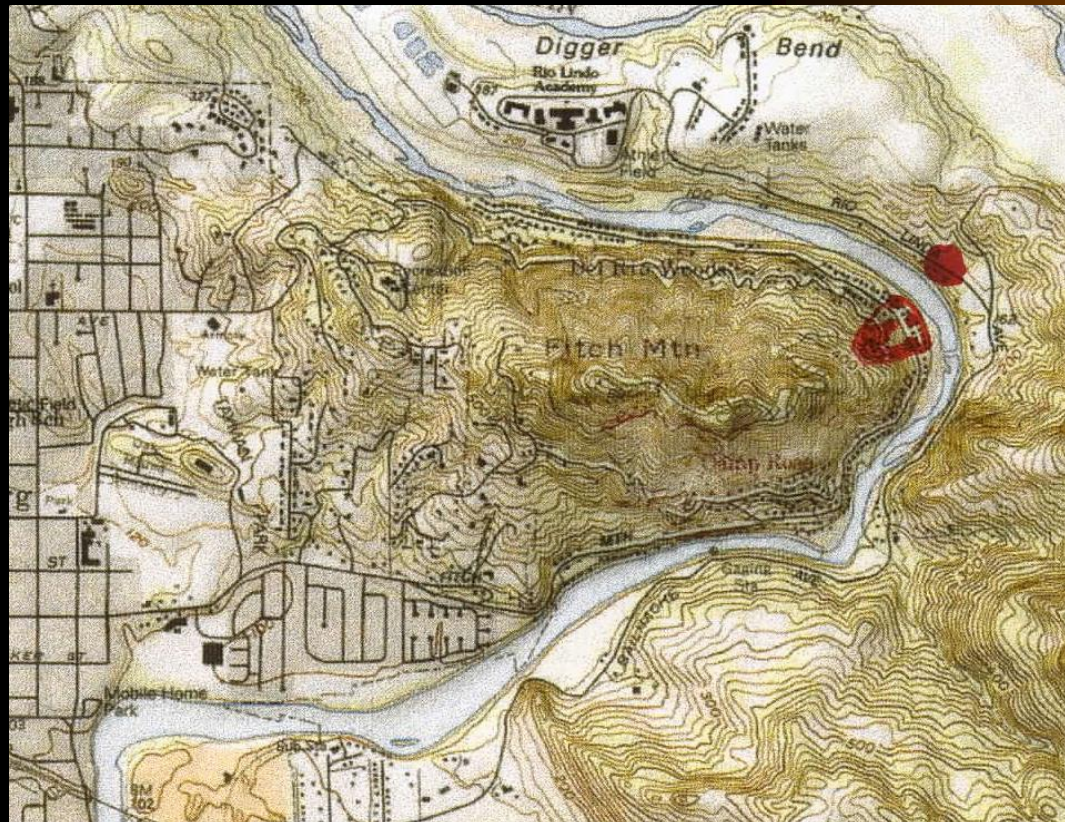
A Small Fire Starts Across the River

Smoke Envelops Fitch Mountain



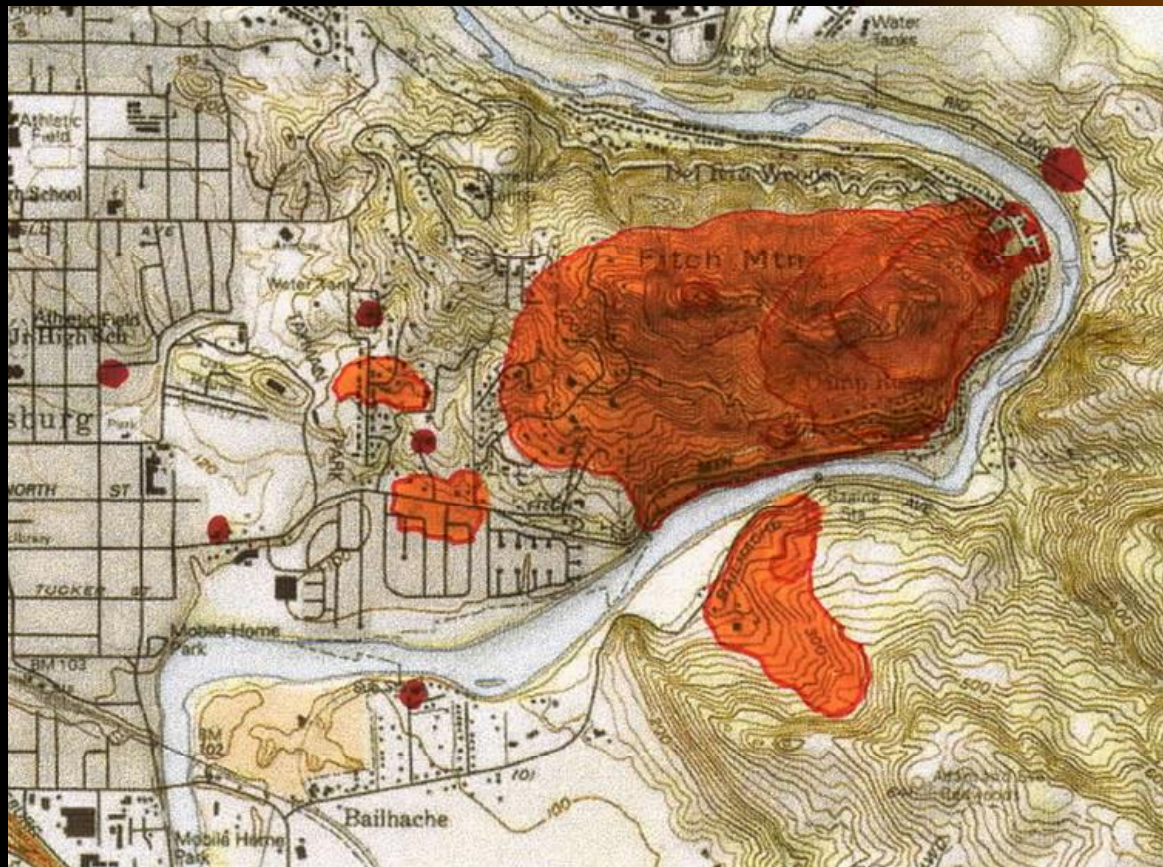
The Fire Continues to Grow

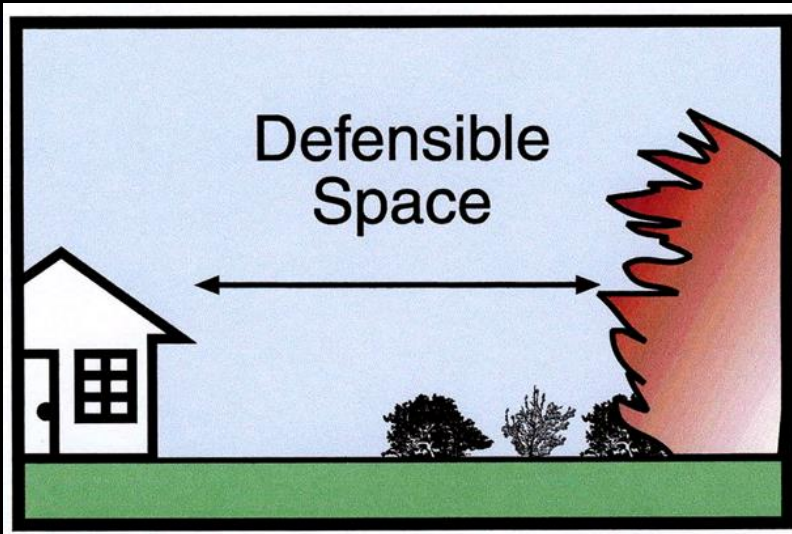

Defensible Space; What Is It?



Defensible space may also aid firefighters by providing a less dangerous area from which to defend a structure.







Defensible space is that area which lies between the house and an oncoming wildfire where the vegetation has been modified to reduce the means of rapidly transmitting fire from native or ornamental growth to any building.

Defensible Space in a Perfect World



- This is the desired result of effective defensible space.
- This property could probably have survived without active suppression efforts
- Can see you see why?

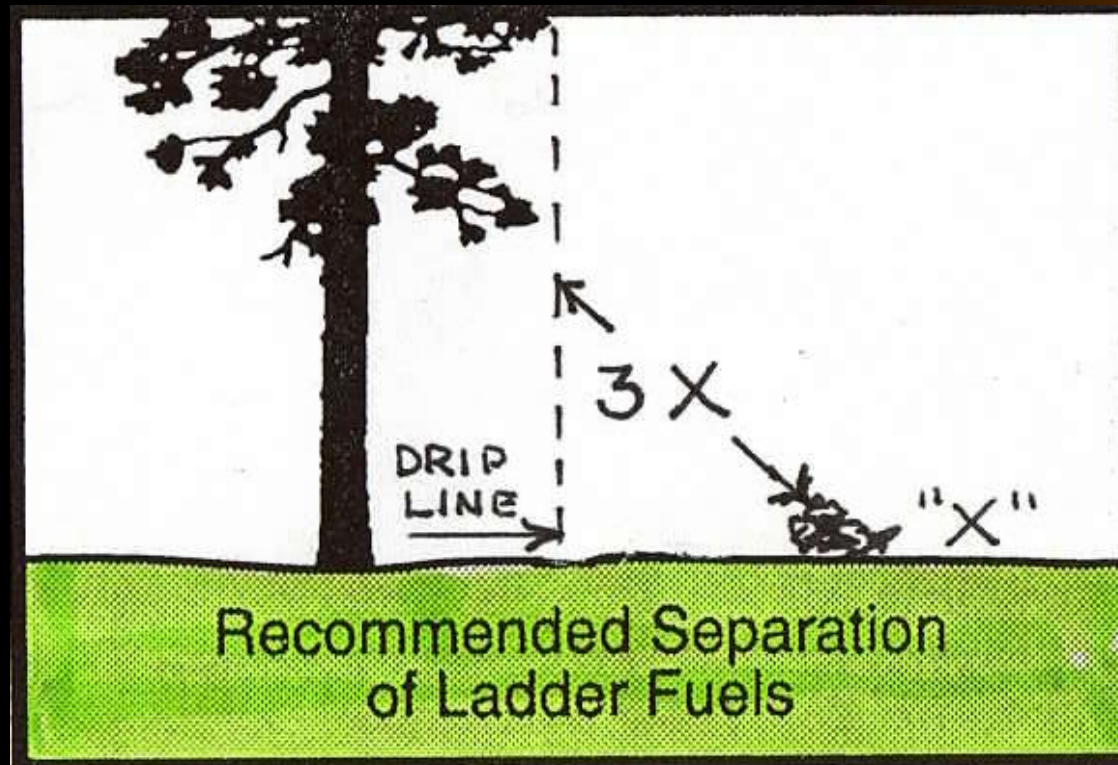
Determining Minimum Defensible Space Recommended Distances

DEFENSIBLE SPACE RECOMMENDED DISTANCES

		Flat to Gently Sloping 0 to 20%	Moderately Steep 21% to 40%	Very Steep 40% +
VEGETATION TYPE		Minimum Distance	Minimum Distance	Minimum Distance
 Grass	GRASS Wildland grass, weeds, and widely scattered shrubs with grass understory.	30 Feet	50 Feet	100 Feet
 Shrubs	SHRUBS Includes shrub dominant areas such as chaparral, manzanita, coastal scrub, etc. Includes vineyards.	50 Feet	150 Feet	150 Feet
 Trees	TREES Includes forested areas such as oak woodland, conifer types, bay, eucalyptus.	30 Feet	50 Feet	150 Feet

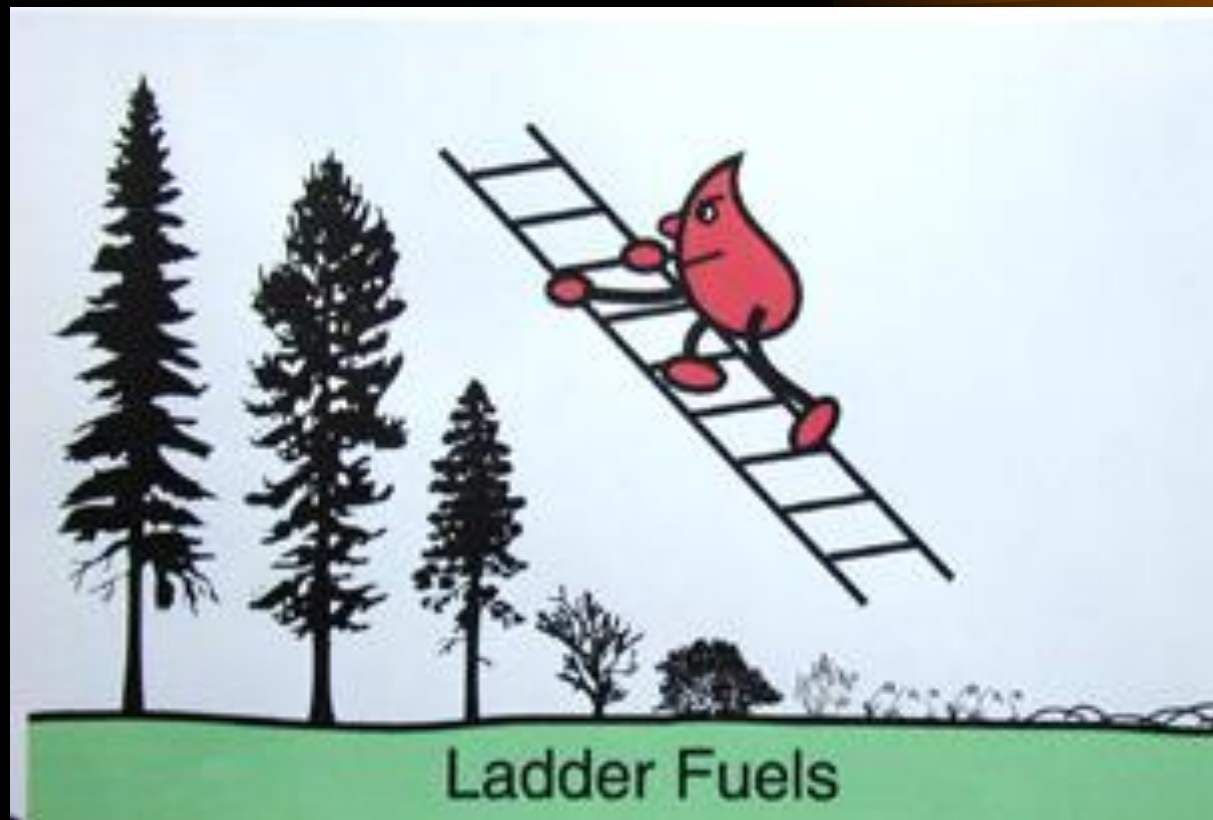
Thin, Separate & Reduce Volume



Recommended Separation of Ladder Fuels

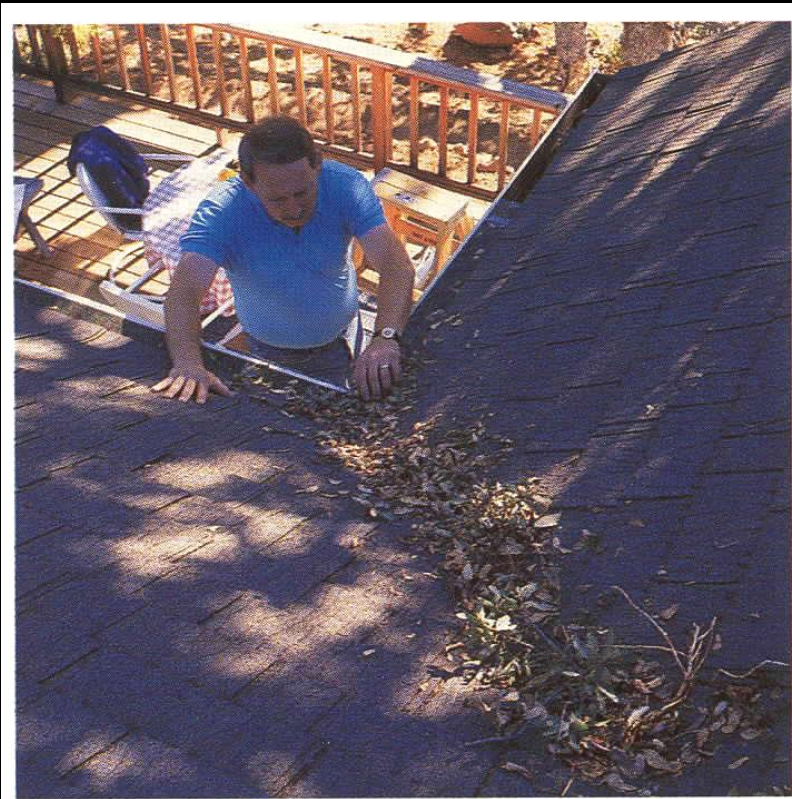

Additional Measures to Protect Your Castle



Leaves & Debris on Roof



- Remove pine needles, leaves or other debris from the roof of any structure on your property.
- May require attention regularly throughout the year.

Pyrophytes Next to your House!

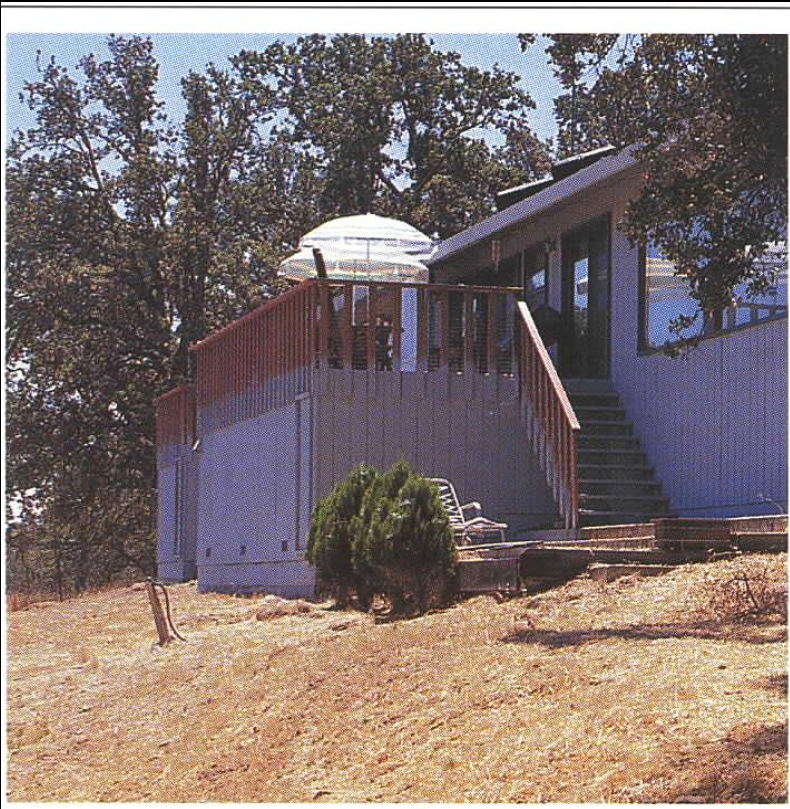


- Pyrophytes, flashy fuels with abundant dead material against the house is tinder waiting to ignite.
- Note the window next to the shrub, the eaves and attic vent at peak - All easy access for fire!

More Pyrophytes and Dead Wood



Enclosing the Underside of Decks



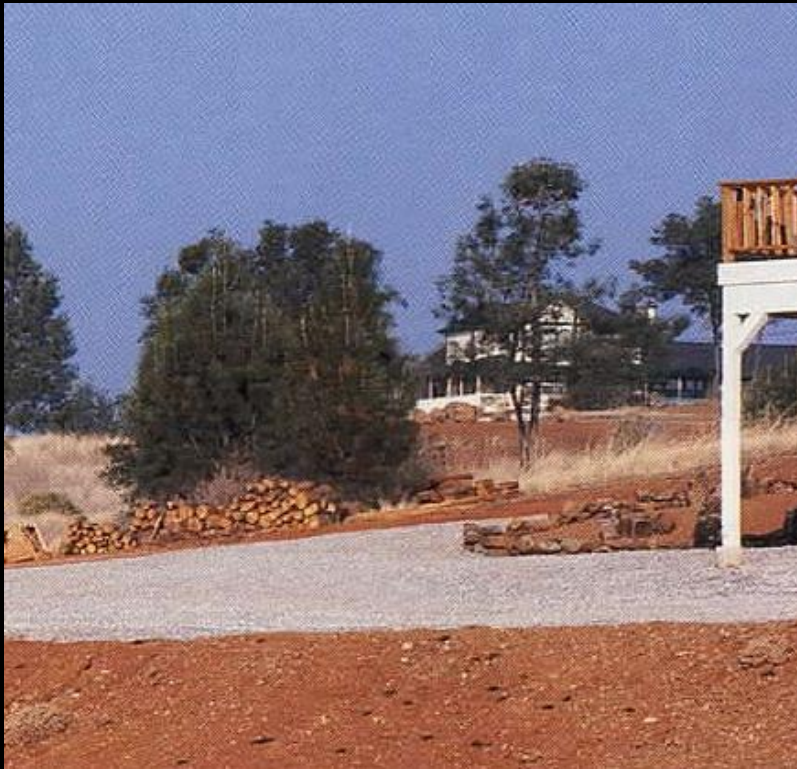
- The undersides of decks and overhangs are heat traps.
- Open decks often accumulate dead vegetation and debris that readily ignites

Flammable Materials Stored in the Yard



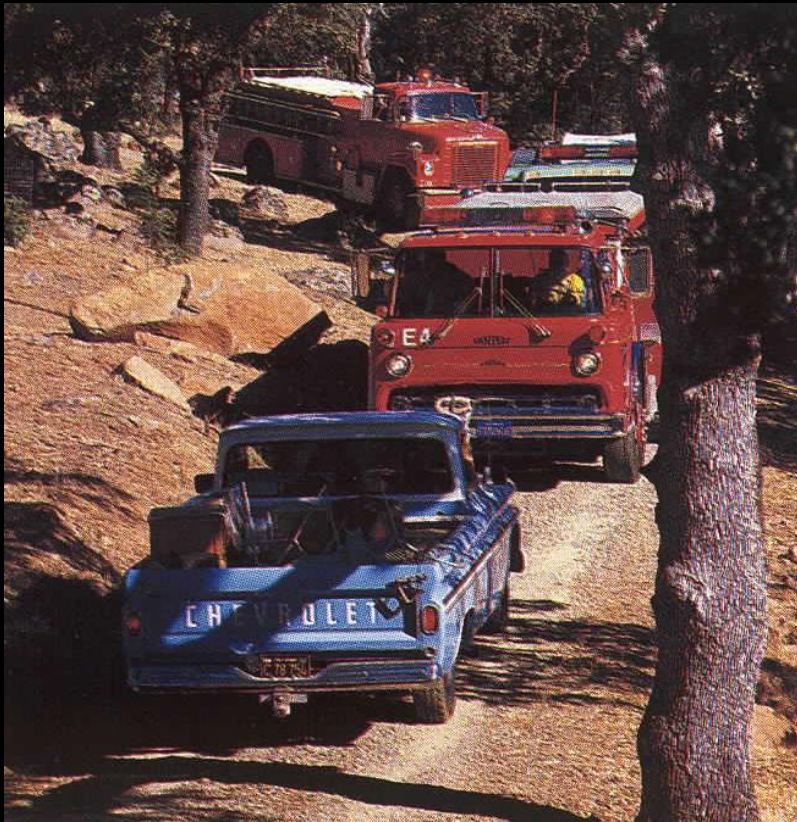
- Storing lumber or other flammable materials in the side yard, particularly with narrow party line fences is asking for trouble.

Firewood, 30 Feet Out!



Store your
firewood well
away from your
house.

Single Lane Roads / Turnouts



- There are many narrow roads on Fitch Mountain.
- Keep vegetation cleared back from road edges
- Maintain turnouts and off road parking
